I will be able to give more time to a class that behaves well and will feel more like having fun if we get the necessary work done on time.

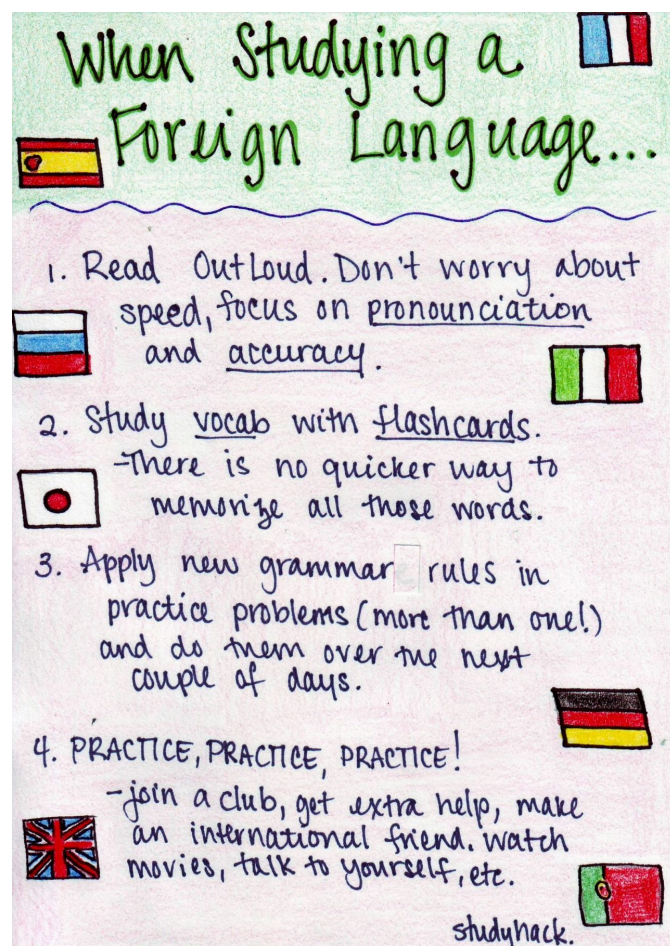

Here are some helpful hints that will make our class a whole lot better!


1. A good attitude makes a good class.

- Discipline referral

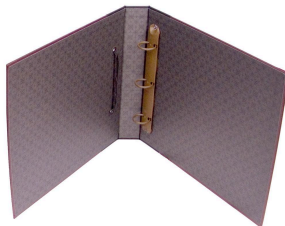
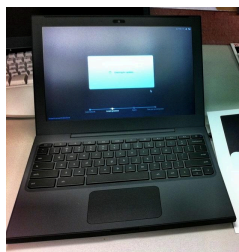
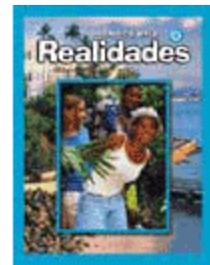
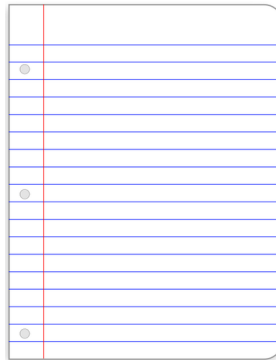
Consequences may vary due to the frequency or seriousness of the behavior. The consequences do not necessarily follow in order.

## Grading

This is how you will be graded.

- Homework: Homework will be assigned and checked. You must have it entirely done to get full credit. Partial credit will be given for assignments that are partially completed and for late assignments completed during that current lesson only. Except in the cases of excused absences, you must have it completed during that current lesson to receive partial credit. Homework will vary between 5-15 points. For the make-up work policy please refer to the school handbook on the school website.
- Exams: Exams will be given often. They will vary in length and style. They will be worth anywhere from 5-100 points.
- Projects: Various projects may be assigned during the grading period. Points will be determined at that time depending on the individual project.
- Participation: Class participation will be monitored daily. It is an important way to monitor pronunciation and check for understanding. Participation includes volunteering and participating in class activities, arriving to class on time, bringing the necessary materials to class and having a good attitude. Remember that frequent participation can make a difference. Your participation grade can be reduced by failing to follow the class rules and lack of participation, as well as negative participation.
- Class Materials: You will need your chromebook for all class activities. You should have a notebook with and or a folder for papers. Class material points are considered into the daily participation points.
- Writing: Various writing assignments may be given throughout the year. They will vary in points based upon the length and requirements of the assignment.
- Retesting will be available upon successful completion of the requirements.
