

Sharpville Area School District
Graduation Pathways in Accordance with Act 158 of 2018
Class of 2023 and Beyond

Along with satisfying the course requirements listed in Policy 217 for graduation, students must also satisfy the Keystone Exam requirements. This requirement has been established by the Pennsylvania Department of Education in Act 158 starting with the Class of 2023. The Class of 2023 and beyond will be required to fulfill one of the pathways listed in Act 158 to successfully graduate. In accordance with Act 158, students are expected to take the Keystone exams that are associated with the identified Keystone courses (Algebra I, Biology, Literature & Composition II). If a successful score is not obtained on any of the Keystone exams (3Pathway #1), students can meet the graduation requirement through one of the pathways described in #2 through #4 below.

#1 Keystone Proficiency Pathway: Scoring proficient or advance on each Keystone Exam Algebra 1, Biology, and Literature.

#2 Keystone Composite Pathway: Earning a satisfactory composite score (4452) on the Algebra I, Biology, and Literature Keystone Exams (while achieving a proficient or advanced score on at least one of the three exams and no less than a basic score on the remaining two).

3 Alternate Assessment Pathway: Earning at least a passing grade for the SASD courses associated with each Keystone Exam (Algebra I, Biology, Literature and Composition II) **PLUS ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:**
