Students with disabilities who violate the Code of Student Conduct, or engage in inappropriate behavior, disruptive or prohibited activities and/or actions injurious to themselves or others, which would typically result in corrective action or discipline of students without disabilities, shall be disciplined in accordance with state and federal laws and regulations and Board policy and, if applicable, their Individualized Education Program (IEP) and Behavior Support Plan.

Students with disabilities - school-aged children within the jurisdiction of the district who have been evaluated and found to have one or more disabilities as defined by law, and who require, because of such disabilities, special education and related services.

Suspensions from school - disciplinary exclusions from school for a period of one (1) to ten (10) consecutive school days.

Expulsions from school - disciplinary exclusions from school by the Board for a period exceeding ten (10) consecutive school days and may include permanent exclusion from school.

Interim alternative educational settings - removal of a student with a disability from his/her current placement. Interim alternative educational settings may be used by school personnel for up to forty-five (45) school days for certain infractions committed by students with disabilities. The IEP team shall determine the interim alternative educational setting; however, this does not constitute a change in placement for a student with a disability.

The Board directs that the district shall comply with provisions and procedural safeguards of the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and federal and state regulations when disciplining students with disabilities for violations of Board policy or district rules or regulations. No student with a disability shall be subjected to a disciplinary change in placement if the student's particular misconduct is a manifestation of his/her disability. However, under certain circumstances a student with a disability may be placed in an interim alternative educational setting by school personnel or the IEP team could, if appropriate, change the student's educational placement to one which is more restrictive than the placement where the misconduct occurred.

For students with mental retardation, any disciplinary suspension or expulsion is a change in educational placement.

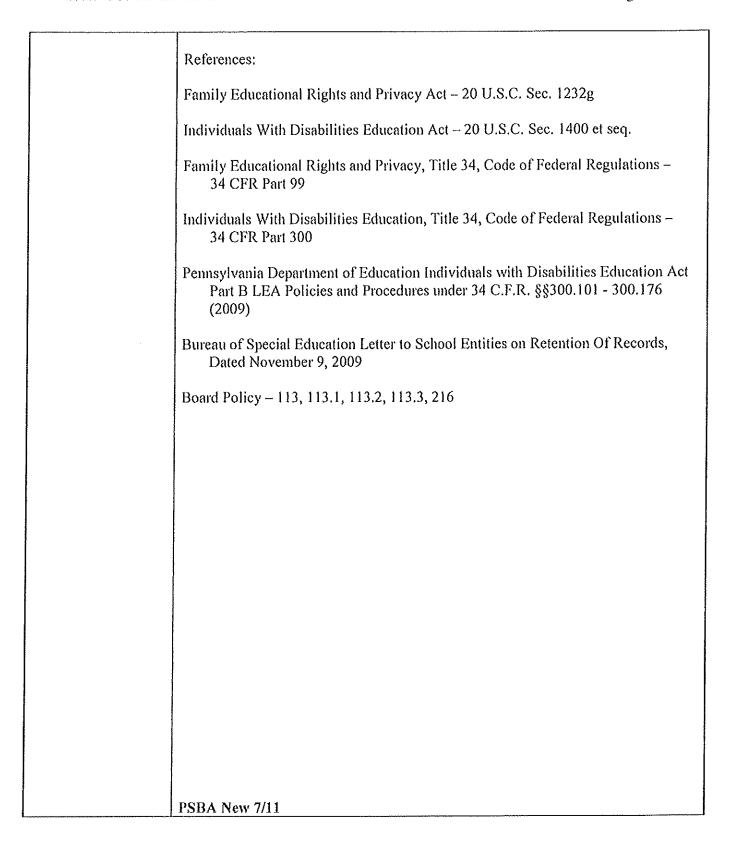

916. SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS

1. Purpose

The Board recognizes that parent/guardian and community volunteers can make many valuable contributions to our schools by providing significant services to students. They enrich and extend the curriculum by sharing hobbies, career expertise, and cultural knowledge. They are willing helpers in our cafeterias, in classrooms, in the library, in athletics, for special projects, or as student mentors.

2. Authority

Volunteers participate in the instructional setting as resource guests. Volunteers shall not be asked to assume the professional responsibilities of school staff, but may, under the direction of a staff member who has been granted permission, provide assistance in the identified activity which is supportive, reinforcing, or enriching in nature.

The Board shall provide authorized volunteers the same liability insurance coverage as provided for employees of the district.

3. Definitions

Guest/Visitor - is an individual who is granted permission by the building principal or designee to be in the presence of district students while being directly supervised by the assigned teacher, coach or advisor.

Chaperone - is an individual under the direct supervision of a teacher, coach or advisor. Chaperones are not to be left alone or unsupervised in the presence of students. An example under this circumstance is the chaperone attending a sponsored class field trip in which the entire group is together. This field trip could be a play, musical, or similar activity. The building principal must grant approval for an individual to function in the role of a chaperone.

Volunteer - is an individual approved through the application process that from time-to-time is in the presence of district students during the regular school day or at functions sponsored and approved by the district. At times, situations may occur that permit those with volunteer status to be alone with students.

Resource People - are not classified as volunteers and can only work with a particular athletic program for a period of time not to exceed one (1) consecutive week during the season. Resource people must be approved by the building principal prior to involvement with the school program.

4. Guidelines

Expectations And Limitations

Volunteers are supervised by and under the direction of the host staff member, whether it is a teacher, coach, and/or advisor. Volunteer status is required of:

- 1. Field Trip Chaperones In this situation an adult supervises a particular group of students while not directly supervised by the teacher, coach, and/or advisor.
- 2. Anyone who will be with district children, but in a capacity of not being directly supervised by an assigned teacher, coach, and/or advisor is required to meet the requirements of volunteer status.
- 3. Student teachers approved by the Board.

Volunteers during the school day must sign in at the building principal's office upon arrival, sign out at departure, and must wear security name tags while they are in the building or activity area.

Teachers/Staff members are responsible to prepare volunteers for their participation in the educational activity, as needed. Teachers/Staff members are responsible to safeguard the right of each student to a confidential educational program and to ensure that volunteers remain confidential.

Volunteers are expected to follow the instruction of the staff member who is responsible to inform the volunteer of the learning activity and to the expectations of the learning. Discipline remains the responsibility of the teacher or staff member in authority. Volunteers are encouraged to redirect students to the task at hand but are not permitted to directly administer student discipline. In instances where health or safety is in jeopardy, the volunteer should notify the teacher immediately.

The privilege of being a volunteer can be revoked at anytime by the administration and/or upon the recommendation of the staff member.

Volunteer Screening

The purpose of volunteer screening is to ensure a safe educational environment for our students, faculty, and staff.

916. SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS - Pg. 3

The recruitment, selection, and training of volunteers shall be monitored by the building principal and/or appropriate staff member.

All requests from individuals to serve in a volunteer status capacity must be approved jointly by the building principal, the coach/advisor, the Superintendent, and ultimately, submitted to the Board for approval.

At the discretion of the Superintendent, volunteer status may become active upon completion of the paperwork on a probationary period until presented to the Board for approval.

In order to be approved as a volunteer, the following criteria must be met:

- 1. The Volunteer Screening Application must be submitted.
- 2. The PA Criminal Records Check, Child Abuse History Clearance and FBI Background Check are required for anyone seeking volunteer status.
- 3. An interview with the building principal or designee, as well as with the appropriate staff member, is required of the applicant. At this time the volunteer policy expectations will be reviewed with the candidate.
- 4. The Board requires that approval as a volunteer is contingent upon passing the Mantoux Tuberculosis Test. An unsatisfactory report will be grounds for disqualification.
- 5. The applicant assumes all costs for clearances and TB tests.

Length Of Volunteer Status

A volunteer's status will be valid as long as the individual remains a volunteer with the school district. The status will become invalid if the district receives information that would prohibit the individual from service as per Board policy. Athletic volunteers will be approved annually.

Guest/Visitor Screening

An individual considered a guest/visitor within the district does not fall under the guidelines and requirements of an individual with volunteer status. Guests or visitors are as specified below, but must be approved by the building principal. In the following situations this individual will not be alone with school children.

1. Chaperones - In the presence of the assigned teacher, coach, and/or advisor.

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

between the

Sharpsville Area School District

and

Jaime L. Roberts

This Agreement is made this 20th day of May, 2013, by and between the Board of Directors (hereinafter "Board") of the Sharpsville Area School District (hereinafter "District"), which has its principal offices located at 701 Pierce Avenue, Sharpsville, Pennsylvania, in the County of Mercer, Pennsylvania, and Jaime L. Roberts, hereinafter "Senior Business Manager"), who resides at 3114 Springwood Drive, Sharpsville, Pennsylvania. It is agreed that the Board hereby employs Jaime L. Roberts and Jaime L. Roberts hereby accepts employment with the District subject to the authority and supervision of the Board and of the duly authorized Superintendent of the District. It is further agreed that such employment shall be subject to the following terms and conditions, including those stated in any appendices hereto:

DUTIES OF EMPLOYMENT

- a. The Senior Business Manager shall be responsible for the adequate and efficient organization and conduct of the District's business affairs in accordance with such policies as the District may adopt, and for keeping the District informed about its business affairs and finances and about the status of the business office and its operations. These duties are further described in the Job Description contained in Appendix A hereto.
- b. The duties of the Senior Business Manager that are stated in this Agreement and its appendices may be changed or supplemented only by a written amendment that is agreed to and signed by the Board and the Senior Business Manager and that states such changes and/or supplemental duties.
- c. At least once a year, the District shall conduct a written assessment of the Senior Business Manager's performance under this Agreement. At least thirty (30) days prior to finalization of such written assessment, the Senior Business Manager's supervisor shall meet with the Senior Business Manager to review his/her performance. In the event that the District determines that the Senior Business Manager's performance has been unsatisfactory in any respect, the written assessment shall describe, in reasonable detail, the instances of unsatisfactory performance and the manner in which such performance should be improved. A copy of the written assessment shall be provided to the Senior Business Manager once finalized. The Senior Business Manager shall be permitted to respond, in

writing, to the finalized assessment within thirty (30) days of receipt and such response shall be attached to and be made a permanent appendix to the assessment.

2. DURATION OF AGREEMENT

- a. The Senior Business Manager's employment under this Agreement shall begin July 1, 2013.
- b. Employment under this Agreement shall expire on June 30, 2018.
- c. Prior to the expiration date stated for this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated only by:
 - i. Resignation of the Senior Business Manager upon 60 days written notice to the Board,
 - ii. Written mutual agreement of the parties, or
 - iii. Discharge of the Senior Business Manager for the causes and under the procedures stated in Section 1089 of the Public School Code of 1949, as amended. In the event of discharge following hearing before the Board, the Senior Business Manager may exercise any rights of appeal of review granted under the Local Agency Law, the Public School Code, and other applicable laws enforceable in the Commonwealth.
- d. At its expiration date, this Agreement shall be deemed automatically renewed for another equal period by the Board unless, at least six (6) months prior to expiration of this Agreement, the Board shall inform the Senior Business Manager, in writing, of its intention not to renew this Agreement.

COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

- a. <u>Compensation</u>. The Senior Business Manager shall be entitled to the following Compensation and Benefits during the term of this Agreement or any amendment or extension to this Agreement:
 - i. <u>Amount of Compensation</u>. The annual salary of the Senior Business Manager shall be as follows:

- ii. <u>Pay Periods</u>. The Senior Business Manager's annual salary shall be paid in equal installments with one installment due on each regular payday of the District.
- iii. <u>Increase in Compensation</u>. The annual salary of the Senior Business Manager shall be subject to at least yearly review. Except as otherwise provided herein, any change in salary and/or benefits shall be made in the form of a written amendment to this Agreement, signed and executed by both parties.
- iv. No Reduction in Compensation. The Compensation of the Senior Business Manager shall not be decreased during the term of this Agreement, or through any amendment or extension of the Agreement, without the prior written approval of the Senior Business Manager.
- b. 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Contributions. The District shall make the following monthly employer contributions into the Senior Business Manager's 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity account:

- c. <u>Personal Days.</u> Subject to the prior approval of the District Superintendent, the Senior Business Manager shall receive two Personal Days per year.
- d. <u>Emergency Days</u>. Subject to the prior approval of the District Superintendent, the Senior Business Manager may receive two (2) non-cumulative Emergency Days per year.
- e. <u>Vacations</u>. The Senior Business Manager shall receive twenty (20) days vacation annually, exclusive of holidays. If work conditions prevent the taking of all vacation days, the Senior Business Manager shall have the option of deferring up to 10 days of the unused vacation days to subsequent school year with approval of the superintendent. As of June 30th each year, the Senior Business Manager shall receive pay for up to ten unused vacation days.

- f. <u>Holidays</u>. The Senior Business Manager shall receive the same holidays applicable to other Administrative Employees of the School District on the first day of this Agreement, or as the same may be increased from time to time.
- g. <u>Sick Leave</u>. The Senior Business Manager shall be entitled to the same sick leave applicable to other Administrative Employees of the School District on the first day of this Contract, or as the same may be increased from time to time.
- h. <u>Family Sick Leave</u>. The Senior Business Manager may use up to five (5) of the entitled sick leave days due to the sickness of his/her spouse, children, grandchildren, parents or his spouse's parents, or siblings or his spouse's siblings.
- i. <u>Bereavement Leave</u>. The Senior Business Manager shall be entitled to bereavement leave as determined by the Superintendent, not to exceed five work days.
- j. <u>Jury Duty/Witness Leave</u>. If the Senior Business Manager is required to serve on any jury or is subpoenaed to give evidence or testimony in any proceeding, the District shall allow the Senior Business Manager to perform such jury or witness duties without loss of salary or benefits.
- k. <u>Insurance Benefits</u>. The Business Manger shall receive the following School District-provided benefits:
 - i. <u>Life Insurance</u>. Group Term Life Insurance with A.D. & D. in the amount of \$49,000.00.
 - ii. Medical Insurance. Group Hospitalization, Dental, Vision, and Prescription Insurance in accordance with the same terms, specification, and conditions applicable to other Administrative Employees of the School District on the first day of the Agreement, or as the same may be increased from time to time.
 - The Senior Business Manager will be responsible for the co-pay in accordance with the SAEA Agreement for hospitalization, surgical, major medical and dental insurance.
 - iii. Disability Income Protection Plan. The District will provide and pay the full premium for a Group Long Term Disability Insurance Plan. The plan will pay monthly benefits after a ninety (90) day elimination period and payments will continue up to five (5) years if less than age 65; to age 70, but not less than one (1) year if age 65 through 68; or one (1) year if age 69 and over. The monthly indemnity will be 66.66667% of salary up to a maximum benefit of four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) per month and shall be fully integrated with

deductible sources of income as specified in the certificate of coverage. In the event that the number of paid days eligible to the Administrator at the time of the disability is not sufficient to cover the elimination period, the District will cover the benefit amount to fulfill the elimination period. The Income Disability Insurance will begin on the 91st consecutive day at which time sick day payments will cease.

1. <u>Professional Dues and Expenses</u>. The District shall provide the Senior Business . Manager with the following:

The District shall provide the Senior Business Manager's annual membership membership in his/her State professional organization. With the approval of the Superintendent, the District shall pay the Senior Business Manager's fees and expenses for attendance at any seminar, workshops, meetings or conferences conducted by such organization.

- ii. The Senior Business Manager, when required to travel by personal vehicle in the performance of School District business, shall be reimbursed at a rate per mile established by the Board of Directors.
- m. <u>Cell Phone Expense</u>. The Senior Business Manager shall be entitled to a payment of \$50.00 per month to cover the cost of business use of her personal cell phone.
- n. <u>Retirement Benefits</u>. The District shall provide the Senior Business Manager with the following retirement benefits:
 - i. Severance Pay. The Senior Business Manager will be paid a severance payment of \$250.00 for each year of service in the Sharpsville Area School District. The method of receiving payment shall be a lump sum payment in the year of retirement to a 403b plan or comparable plan as specified in the District's plan document. This is an employer contribution and no cash option is available. Contributions are limited to Section 415 limits. Excessive contributions will be made to the employee's account in the next subsequent year up to the 415 limit.

ii. Medical Insurance

a. The District shall continue to provide group medical insurance (hospitalization, surgical, and major medical coverage) through the District's group medical insurance plan for the retiree, spouse, and eligible dependents, if applicable, subject to the limitations which follow.

- b. If both husband and wife are employed by the District, only one of the two will be eligible to participate in the program. Coverage shall continue until age sixty-six (66) or until Medicare coverage begins, whichever comes first, or until such time as he/she becomes gainfully employed and becomes eligible for insurance benefits by virtue of that employment. In the event of death of the retired employee prior to Medicare eligibility, the coverage will be provided by the District for the spouse until age sixty-six (66) or Medicare coverage begins (whichever occurs first) and/or any eligible dependent who meets the criteria for the same under the master contract to the date at which the deceased employee would have reached the age of sixty-six (66) or until Medicare begins (whichever occurs first).
- c. The District will provide premium payments equal to the total cost of insurance at the time of retirement less any amount the retiree is eligible to receive under Act 23 or similar legislation. The retiree shall continue to submit the same co-pay that is in effect for Administrators. The maximum benefit upon retirement shall be \$50,000.00 in premium payments, with the Administrator being solely responsible for any increases in premium after the date of retirement. Any difference in the actual cost of the selected coverage and the capped amount paid by the District as specified above shall be the responsibility of the retiree.
- d. The District will bill the retired administrator for the remaining premium dollars and the employee will remit this resulting payment to the employer on a monthly basis no later than the twenty-fifth (25th) of the month prior to the month of coverage. An additional grace period of thirty (30) calendar days will be provided. Failure to submit the co-pay and/or differential by the conclusion of the grace period will result in cancellation of the provided coverage.
- e. Should the retiree and/or surviving spouse be covered or eligible to be covered under another medical insurance plan, the District's obligation to provide benefits under this provision shall cease for the period of time these benefits are so provided and/or available. Retirees or surviving spouses shall be required to verify availability/non-availability of medical insurance.
- iii. Other Medical Benefits. All other health care benefits available at the time of retirement may be continued with the retiree assuming the premium cost for the same.

iv. <u>Accrued Vacation Pay</u>. Accrued vacation pay applicable to other Administrative Employees of the District on the first day of this Agreement, or as the same may be increased from time to time.

4. General Provisions

- a. <u>Headings</u>. The section headings contained in the Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect in any way the meaning or interpretation of the Agreement.
- b. <u>Statutory References</u>. All references to the Code contained herein shall also refer to any amendment or recodification of such code.
- c. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- d. <u>Unlawful Provision</u>. If any provision of this Agreement be declared illegal by final decision of a court of this Commonwealth said provision shall be deemed deleted from this Agreement and the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect if not otherwise affected by said deletion.
- e. <u>Integrated Agreement</u>. This Agreement is intended by the parties to and does constitute the entire agreement for the parties with respect to the employment of the Senior Business Manager by the District. This Agreement supersedes any and all prior understandings, written or oral, between the parties with respect to the employment of the Senior Business Manager by the District.
- f. Modification of Agreement. This Agreement shall not be modified by any Board rules, regulations, or policies, except as herein provided. Any such modification shall be invalid unless in writing, duly executed by the District and the Senior Business Manager.
- g. <u>Binding Obligations</u>. This Agreement and all appendices, addenda, and amendments made part thereof shall be binding upon the Board and the School District and upon their successors and assigns.
- 5. <u>Appendices</u>. The appendices to this Agreement, including those addressing and further describing the particular duties of the Senior Business Manager are as follows:

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BY AND BETWEEN

Sharpsville Police Department (Law Enforcement Authority)

and

Sharpsville Area School District (School Entity)

May 7, 2013

I. Joint Statement of Concern

A. Parties

The following Law Enforcement Authority or Authorities enter into and agree to adhere to the policies and procedures contained in the Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter "Memorandum"):

Sharpsville Police Department

The following School Entity or Entities enter into and agree to adhere to the policies and procedures contained in the Memorandum:

Sharpsville Area School District

- B. The purpose of this Memorandum is to establish procedures to be followed when certain specific incidents -described in Section II below- occur on school property, at any school sponsored activity, or on a conveyance as described in the Safe Schools Act, such as a school bus, providing transportation to or from a school or school sponsored activity.
- C. It is further the purpose of the Memorandum to foster a relationship of cooperation and mutual support between the parties hereto as they work together to maintain the physical security and safety of the School Entity.

D. Legal Authority

1. The parties to the Memorandum enter into this agreement in accordance with the provisions of Article XIII-A of the Public School Code of 1949, as amended, 24 P.S. §§13-1301-A et seq. (popularly and hereinafter "Safe Schools Act"), requiring all school entities to develop a memorandum of understanding with local law enforcement which sets forth procedures to be followed when an incident involving an act of violence or possession of a weapon, as further specified in Section II of this document, by any person

occurs on school property. Law enforcement protocols shall be developed in cooperation with local law enforcement and the Pennsylvania State Police. 24 P. S. §§13-1303-A(c).

- 2. In so recognizing this legal authority, the parties acknowledge their respective duties pursuant to the Safe Schools Act and hereby agree to support and cooperate with one another in carrying out their joint and several responsibilities thereunder.
- 3. The Law Enforcement Authority shall be governed by the following reporting and information exchange guidelines:
 - a. Criminal History Record Information Act, 18 Pa. C.S. §§9101 et seq.
 - b. The prohibition against disclosures, specified in Section IV(C)(5) of this Memorandum
- 4. When sharing information and evidence necessary for the Law Enforcement Authority to complete their investigation, the School Entity shall:
 - a. Comply with Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act, hereinafter, FERPA, 20 U.S.C. §1232g and its implementing regulations at 34 C.F.R. §99.1 et seq., and 22 Pa. Code §§12.31-12.33 and any amendments thereto.
 - b. Comply with the requirements of the Safe Schools Act, 24 P.S. §§13-1303-A and 13-1317.2 and any amendments thereto.
 - c. Complete reports as required by the Safe Schools Act, 24 P.S. §§13-1303-A and any amendments thereto.
- The School Entity may disclose personally identifiable information from the educational record of a student to the Law Enforcement Authority if a health or safety emergency exists and knowledge of that information is necessary to protect the health or safety of the student or other individuals. In determining whether a health or safety emergency exists, the School Entity any take into account the totality of the circumstances pertaining to a threat to the health or safety of a student or other individuals. If the School Entity determines that there is an articulable and significant threat to the health or safety of a student or other individuals, it may disclose information from education records to the Law Enforcement Authority, if knowledge of that information is necessary for the Law Enforcement Authority to protect the health or safety of the student or other individuals. The School Entity must record the articulable and significant threat to the health or safety of a student or other individuals so that it can demonstrate- to parents, students and the Family Policy Compliance Office¹- what circumstances led it to determine that the health or safety emergency existed and why the disclosure was justified.

¹ Questions related to FERPA should be directed to the Family Compliance Office within the US Department of Education

E. Priorities of the Law Enforcement Authority

- 1. Help the School Entity prevent delinquent acts through preventive measures, including referrals to support services, diversionary programs, restorative practices, school-wide behavior supports, education, and deterrence.
- 2. Investigate all incidents reported to have occurred on school property, at any school sponsored activity or on any public conveyance providing transportation to or from a school or school sponsored activity, including but not limited to a school bus. The investigation of all reported incidences shall be conducted in the manner that the Local Enforcement Authority, in its sole discretion, deem appropriate; but any investigation shall be conducted so as to involve as little disruption of the school environment as is practicable.
- Identify those responsible for the commission of the reported incident and, where appropriate, apprehend and prosecute those individuals. Identification and apprehension procedures shall involve as little disruption of the school environment as is practicable.
- 4. Establish and maintain a cooperative relationship with the School Entity in the reporting and resolution of all incidents described in Section II of this document.

F. Priorities of the School Entity

- Help the Law Enforcement Authority prevent delinquent acts through preventive measures, including referrals to support services, diversionary programs, restorative practices, school-wide behavior supports, education, and deterrence.
- 2. Create safe learning environment, which support each student's well-being and opportunities to reach their full potential while balancing and protecting the rights of all students.
- 3. Establish and maintain cooperative relationships with the Law Enforcement Authority in the reporting and resolution of all incidents described in Section II of this document.
- 4. Provide the Law Enforcement Authority with all relevant information and required assistance in the event of a report incident.
- 5. Provide the Law Enforcement Authority with a copy of the Schools Entity's behavior support services procedures and invite Law Enforcement Authority representatives to behavior support trainings.

II. Notification of Incidents to Law Enforcement

The School Entity shall immediately report, by the most expeditious means possible, to the Law Enforcement Authority the occurrence of any of the following incidents occurring on school property, at any school sponsored activity or on a conveyance as described in the Safe School Act, including a bus providing transportation to or from a school or school sponsored activity.

A. Mandatory Notification

- 1. The following offenses under 18 Pa. C. S. (relating to crimes and offenses):
 - a. Section 908 (relating to prohibited offensive weapons)
 - b. Section 912 (relating to possession of weapon on school property).
 - i. As used in this Memorandum, "weapon" shall include, but not be limited to, any knife, cutting instrument, cutting tool, nunchuck, stick, firearm, shotgun, rifle, metal knuckles, billy club, blackjack, grenade, incendiary device, and any other tool, instrument, or implement capable of inflicting serious bodily injury.
 - ii. This reporting requirement does not apply to a weapon which is: (a) used, as part of a school approved program, by an individual who is participating in the program
 - c. Chapter 25 (relating to criminal homicide).
 - d. Section 2701 (relating to simple assault).
 - e. Section 2702 (relating to aggravated assault).
 - f. Section 2705 (relating to recklessly endangering another person)
 - g. Section 2706 (relating to terroristic threats).
 - h. Section 2709 (relating to harassment).
 - i. Section 2709.1 (related to stalking).
 - j. Section 2901 (relating to kidnapping).
 - k. Section 2902 (relating to unlawful restraint).
 - 1. Section 3121 (relating to rape).
 - m. Section 3122.1 (relating to statutory sexual assault).
 - n. Section 3123 (relating to involuntary deviate sexual intercourse).
 - o. Section 3124.1 (relating to sexual assault).
 - p. Section 3124.2 (relating to institutional sexual assault).
 - q. Section 3125 (relating to aggravated indecent assault).
 - r. Section 3126 (relating to indecent assault).
 - s. Section 3127 (relating to indecent exposure).
 - t. Section 3301 (relating to arson and related offenses).
 - u. Section 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism).
 - v. Section 3502 (relating to burglary).
 - w. Section 3503(a) and (b)(1)(v) (relating to criminal trespass).
 - x. Section 3701 (relating to robbery).
 - y. Section 3702 (relating to robbery of motor vehicle).
 - z. Section 5501 (relating to riot).
 - aa. Section 6110.1 (relating to possession of firearm by minor).
 - bb. Section 6305 (relating to sale of tobacco)
- 2. The possession, use, or sale of a controlled substance, designer drug, or drug paraphernalia as defined in "The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and

Cosmetic Act," as amended, 35 P.S. §§780-101 et seq. popularly known as the "Drug Act."

- a. As defined in the Drug Act, the term "controlled substance" shall include the possession, use or sale of controlled substances includes, but is not limited to, marijuana, cocaine, crack cocaine, heroin, LSD, PCP, amphetamines and steroids. See 35 P.S. §§780-101 (relating to definitions).
- b. As defined in the Drug Act, the term "designer drug" includes, but is not limited to, phenethylamines, N-substituted peperidines, morphinans, ecgonines, quinazolinones, substituted indoles and arylcycloaklamines. See 35 P.S. §780-102.
- c. As defined in the Drug Act, the term "drug paraphernalia" may include, depending on the circumstances, hypodermic syringes, needles and rolling papers, as well as other equipment or materials utilized for the purpose of ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing controlled substances into the body. See 35 P.S §780-102.
- d. Attempts, solicitations or conspiracy to commit any of the offenses listed in subsections (1) and (2) of this section.
- e. An offense for which registration is required under 42 Pa C.S §9795.1 (relating to registration).
- f. Purchase, consumption, possession or transportation of liquor or malt or brewed beverages by a person under 21 years of age. *See* 18 Pa C.S. §6308(a).

B. Discretionary Notification

The School entity may report to the Law Enforcement Authority having jurisdiction where the incident occurred, of any of the following incidents occurring on school property, at any school sponsored activity or on a conveyance as described in the Safe School Act, including a school but providing transportation to or from a school or a school sponsored activity.

- 1. The following offenses under 18 Pa C.S (relating to crimes and offenses):
 - a. Section 3503(b)(1)(i), (ii), (iii) and (iv), (b.1) and (b.2) (relating to criminal trespass).
 - b. Chapter 39 (relating to theft and related offenses).
 - c. Section 5502 (relating to failure of disorderly persons to disperse upon official order).
 - d. Section 5503 (relating to disorderly conduct).
 - e. Section 6306.1 (relating to use of tobacco in schools prohibited).
 - f. Attempt, solicitation or conspiracy to commit any of the offenses listed in subsection (1).
- C. Notification of the Law Enforcement Authority when incident involves children with disabilities

- 1. If a child with a disability commits an incident of misconduct, the School Entity and the Law Enforcement Authority should take into consideration that the child's behavior may be a manifestation of the disability, and there may be no intent to commit an unlawful act. A child with a disability under this Subsection shall mean a student with an IEP, a protected handicapped student with a service agreement that includes a behavior support plan, or such student for whom an evaluation is pending under 22 Pa. Code §§ 14.123 (relating to evaluation), 15.5 (relating to school district initiated evaluation and provision of services), 15.6 (relating to parent initiated evaluation and provision of services) or Chapter 711 (relating to charter school and cyber charter school services and programs for children with disabilities).
- 2. In the event a child with a disability commits a mandatory notification offense under Subsection A, the School Entity shall provide immediate notification to the Law Enforcement Authority regardless of the disability. Such notification shall state that the child has an IEP or service agreement that includes a behavior support plan, may include the School Entity's recommendation that Law Enforcement Authority intervention may not be required, and may advise that the School Entity will act to address the student's behavior need as required by applicable federal and state law and regulations, including 22 Pa. Code §§ 14.133 (relating to positive behavior support), 15.3 (relating to protected handicapped students—general) or 711.46 (relating to positive behavior support). The Law Enforcement Authority may take the recommendation under advisement but reserves the right to investigate and file charges.
- 3. In the event a child with a disability commits a discretionary notification offense under Subsection B, and the School Entity does not believe that Law Enforcement Authority intervention is necessary, the School Entity will address the student's behavior need as required by applicable federal and state law and regulations, including 22 Pa. Code §§14.133, 15.3 or 711.46.
- 4. In accordance with 34 C.F.R. 300.535 (relating to referral to and action by law enforcement and judicial authorities), nothing shall prohibit the School Entity from reporting an offense committed by a child with a disability to the Law Enforcement Authority, and nothing shall prevent the Law Enforcement Authority and judicial authorities from exercising their responsibilities with regard to the application of federal and state law to crimes committed by a child with a disability.
- 5. The School Entity, when reporting an offense committed by a child with a disability, must ensure that copies of the special education and disciplinary records of the child are transmitted for consideration by the appropriate authorities to the Law Enforcement Authority to whom the incident was reported.
- The School Entity, when reporting an offense committed by a child with a
 disability, may transmit copies of the child's special education and
 disciplinary records only to the extent that the transmission is permitted by
 FERPA.

- 7. When an incident occurs involving a student with a disability as required by 22 Pa Code §14.104 (relating to special education plans), Board Policy 113.1 shall be followed.
- D. Law Enforcement Response to Notification
 - 1. When notified of an incident listed in Subsections A or B, the Law Enforcement Authority's decision to investigate and file charges is at the sole discretion of the Law Enforcement Authority, and it may be made in consultation with the School Entity.
 - 2. In determining whether to file charges, the Law Enforcement Authority is encouraged to consult with the District Attorney. When appropriate under the law, part of this consultation may include a discussion about the availability or propriety of utilization a diversionary program as an alternative to filing charges.
- E. Upon notification of the incident to the Law Enforcement Authority, the School Entity shall provide as much of the following information as is available at the time of notification. In no even shall the gathering of information unnecessarily delay notification:
 - 1. Whether the incident is in-progress or has concluded.
 - 2. Nature of the incident.
 - 3. Exact location of the incident.
 - 4. Number of persons involved in the incident.
 - 5. Names and ages of the individuals involved.
 - 6. Weapons, if any, involved in the incident.
 - 7. Whether the weapons, if any, have been secured and, if so, the custodian of the weapons.
 - 8. Injuries involved.
 - 9. Whether EMS or the Fire Department were notified.
 - 10. Identity of the school contact person.
 - 11. Identity of the witnesses to the incident, if any.
 - 12. Whether the incident involves a student with a disability and, if so, the type of disability and its impact on the student's behavior.
 - 13. All other such information as is known to the school authority believed to be relevant to the incident.
- F. No later than September 30th of each year the School Entity shall furnish to its Incident Command Post the following information for the purpose of assisting the Law Enforcement Authority in responding to an emergency:
 - 1. Blueprints or floor plans of the school buildings.
 - 2. Aerial photo, map or layout of the school campus, adjacent properties and surrounding streets or roads.
 - 3. Location(s) of predetermined or prospective command posts.
 - 4. Current teacher/employee roster.
 - 5. Current student roster.

- 6. Most recent school yearbook.
- 7. School fire-alarm shutoff location and procedures.
- 8. School sprinkler system shutoff location and procedures.
- 9. Gas/utility line layouts and shutoff valve locations.
- 10. Cable/satellite television shutoff location and procedures.
- 11. Other such information as is known to the School Entity and believed to be relevant to assisting the Law Enforcement Authority's ability to respond to an emergency.

III. Law Enforcement Authority Response

- A. Depending on the totality of the circumstances, initial response by the Law Enforcement Authority may include:
 - 1. For incidents in progress:
 - a. Meet with contact person and locate scene of incident.
 - b. Stabilize incident.
 - c. Provide/arrange for emergency medical treatment, if necessary.
 - d. Control the scene of the incident.
 - i. Secure any physical evidence at the scene.
 - ii. Identify involved persons and witnesses.
 - e. Conduct investigation.
 - f. Exchange information.
 - g. Confer with officials of the School Entity to determine the extent of Law Enforcement Authority involvement required by the situation.
 - 2. Incidents not in progress:
 - a. Meet with contact person.
 - b. Recover any physical evidence.
 - c. Conduct investigation.
 - d. Exchange information,
 - e. Confer with official of the School Entity to determine the extent of Law Enforcement Authority involvement required by the situation.
 - 3. Incidents involving delayed reporting
 - a. In the event that a reportable incident occurs on school property, at any school sponsored activity, or on a conveyance as described in the Safe Schools Act, such as a school bus, providing transportation to or from a school or school sponsored activity, the School Entity shall report the incident to the Law Enforcement Authority immediately upon its notification.
 - b. If such incident is initially reported to the School Entity, the School Entity shall proceed as outlined in Section II (A-C) above.

- 4. Incidents initially reported to the Law Enforcement Authority:
 - a. If the incident in Section II (A-B) is initially reported to the Law Enforcement Authority, Law Enforcement Authority shall proceed directly with its investigation and shall notify the School Entity of the incident as outlined in Section II (A-E).

B. Custody of Actors

- 1. Students identified as actors in reported incidents may be taken into custody at the discretion of the investigating officer of the Law Enforcement Agency under any of the following circumstances:
 - a. The student has been placed under arrest.
 - b. The student is being placed under investigative detention.
 - c. The student is being taken into custody for the protection of the student.
 - d. The student's parent or guardian consents to the release of the student to law enforcement custody.
- 2. The investigating officer of the Law Enforcement Authority shall take all appropriate steps to protect the legal and constitutional rights of those students being taken into custody.

IV. Assistance of School Entities

A. In Loco Parentis

- 1. Teachers, Guidance Counselors, Vice Principals and Principals in the School Entity have the right to exercise the same authority as a parent, guardian or person in parental relation to such student concerning conduct and behavior over the pupils attending school, during the time they are in attendance, including the time required in going to and from their homes.
- School Entity authorities' ability to stand in loco parentis over children does
 not extend to matters beyond conduct and discipline during school, school
 activities, or on any public conveyance as described in the Safe Schools Act,
 such as a school bus, providing transportation to or from school or school
 sponsored activity.

B. Notification of Parent or Guardian

Parents or guardians of all victims and suspects directly involved in an
incident listed in Sections II (A-B) shall be immediately notified of the
incident and they shall be informed about any notification regarding that
incident that has been, or may be, made to the Law Enforcement Authority.

- 2. The School Entity shall document attempts made to reach the parents or guardians of all victims, witnesses and suspects directly involved in an incident listed under Section II (A-B).
- Except in cases in which the suspect student has been injured and requires
 medical attention, the decision to notify a suspect's parents or guardians shall
 be a cooperative decision between school officials and law enforcement
 authorities.

C. Scope of School Entity's Involvement

1. General Principles

Once the Law Enforcement Authority assumes primary responsibility for a matter, the legal conduct of interviews, interrogations, searches, seizures of property and arrests are within the purview of the Law Enforcement Authority. The School Entity shall defer to the Law Enforcement Authority on matters of criminal and juvenile law procedure, except as is necessary to protect the interests of the School Entity. The Law Enforcement Authority shall keep the Chief Administrator of the School Entity, or his/her designees, informed of the status of pending investigations.

2. Victims

- a. The Law Enforcement Authority does not need to secure parental permission to interview a victim.
- b. The School Entity shall promptly notify the parent or guardian of a victim when the Law Enforcement Authority interviews that victim. The Law Enforcement Authority shall follow its policies and procedures when interviewing a victim to ensure the protection of the victim's legal and constitutional rights.
- c. In the event a victim is interviewed by the Law Enforcement Authority on school property, a guidance counselor or similar designated personnel may be present during the interview.

3. Witnesses

- a. The Law Enforcement Authority does not need to secure parental permission to interview a witness to a reportable incident.
- b. The School Entity shall promptly notify the parent or guardian of a witness when the Law Enforcement Authority interviews that witness. The Law Enforcement Authority shall follow its policies and procedures when interviewing a witness to ensure the protection of the witness's legal and constitutional rights.
- c. In the event a witness is interviewed by the Law Enforcement Authority on school property, a guidance counselor or similar designated personnel should be present during the interview.

4. Suspects and Custodial Interrogation

- a. Depending upon the individual circumstances of the incident, a juvenile suspect may or may not be competent to waive his/her rights to consult with an interested adult and/or an attorney prior to interrogation by law enforcement authorities.
- b. The School Entity shall help the Law Enforcement Authority to secure the permission and presence of at least one parent or guardian of a student suspect before that student is interrogated by the Law Enforcement Authority.
- c. When a parent or guardian is not present, a School Entity official shall not stand in the place of the parent or guardian during an interview by the Law Enforcement Authority.
- d. If an interested adult cannot be contacted, the School Entity shall defer to the investigating Law Enforcement Authority, which will protect the student suspect's legal and constitutional rights as required by law.

5. Conflicts of Interest

- a. The parties to this Memorandum recognize that if a School Entity employee, contractor, or other person acting on behalf of the School Entity is the subject of an investigation, a conflict of interest may exist between the School Entity and the adult suspect.
- b. Neither the individual that is the subject of the investigation, nor any person acting as his/her subordinate or direct supervisor, shall be present during interviews of student co-suspects, victims or witnesses by the Law Enforcement Authority.
- c. Neither the individual that is the subject of the investigation, nor his/her subordinate(s) or direct supervisor(s), shall be informed of the contents of the statements made by student co-suspects, victims or witnesses, except at the discretion of the Law Enforcement Authority or as otherwise required by law.

D. Reporting Requirements

All school entities are required to submit an annual report, which will include violence statistics and reports to the Department of Education's Office of Safe Schools. This annual report must include all new incidents described in Section II (A) above. Prior to submitting the required annual report, each chief school administrator and each police department having jurisdiction over school property of the School Entity shall do the following:

 No later than thirty days prior to the deadline for submitting the annual report, the Chief School Administrator shall submit the report to the Law Enforcement Authority with jurisdiction over the relevant school property. The Law Enforcement Authority shall review the report and compare the

- data regarding criminal offenses and notification of Law Enforcement to determine its accuracy.
- 2. No later than fifteen days prior to the deadline for submitting the annual report, the Law Enforcement Authority shall notify the Chief School Administrator, in writing, whether the report accurately reflects police incident data. Where the Law Enforcement Authority determines that the report accurately reflects police incident data, the chief of police shall sign the report. Where the Law Enforcement Authority determines that the report does not accurately reflect police incident data, the Law Enforcement Authority shall indicate any discrepancies between the report and police incident data.
- 3. Prior to submitting the annual report, the Chief School Administrator and the Law Enforcement Authority shall attempt to resolve discrepancies between the report and police incident data. Where a discrepancy remains unresolved, the Law Enforcement Authority shall notify the Chief School Administrator and the Office in writing.
- 4. Where a Law Enforcement Authority fails to take action as required under clause (1) or (2), the Chief School Administrator shall submit the annual report and indicate that the Law Enforcement Authority failed to take action as required under clause (1) or (2).
- 5. Where there are discrepancies between the School Entity's incident data and the police incident data, the following shall occur:
 - a. The Sharpsville Police Department must notify the appropriate building principal to validate any corrections deemed necessary.

V. Media Relations

A. Release of Information

- 1. The release of information concerning incidents reportable to the Law Enforcement Authority pursuant to the terms of this Memorandum shall be coordinated between the Law Enforcement Authority and the School Entity.
- The parties shall release as much information as is allowable by law with due
 deliberation given to the investigative considerations and the need to limit
 disruptions to school functions and protect the privacy of the students and
 staff involved.

VI. General Provisions

- A. This Memorandum does not create any contractual rights or obligations between the signatory Law Enforcement Authority, the signatory School Entity, any additional signatory authorities or entities, or their respective officers, employees, agents or representatives.
- B. This Memorandum may be amended, expanded or modified at any time upon the written consent of the parties, but in any event must be reviewed and re-executed within two years of the date of its original execution and every two years thereafter.

- C. If changes in state or federal law require changes to Memorandum, the parties shall amend this Memorandum.
- D. All parties to this Memorandum will communicate fully and openly with each other in order to resolve any problems that may arise in the fulfillment of the terms of this Memorandum.

AND NOW, on this day, May 7, 2013, the parties hereby acknowledge the foregoing as the terms and conditions of their understanding.
